### **Building a Common Agenda: Drive towards achieving Uganda's FP2020 and EWEC Commitments**

In line with the Global commitments on the Strategy to improve women's, children's and adolescents' health, through "Every Women Every Child" (EWEC) Global Strategy commitments made at the UN General Assembly in New York in 2010, and the "FP2020" commitments made at the Family Planning London Summit of 2012, Uganda made commitments that she has been tracking. Uganda renewed the EWEC commitments in 2016 and FP2020 commitments in 2017, in order to keep abreast with the transition from the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Agenda 2030.

One promising approach for tracking Uganda's commitments to FP2020 and EWEC Global Strategy is the Motion Tracker – a six-step, customized dynamic framework for strengthening accountability and driving local action. The tracker is currently administered by the Samasha Medical Foundation. The Motion Tracker works to increase understanding and generate consensus among CSOs on what needs to be done for governments to meet their family planning commitments. It also serves as a framework to guide implementation activities among stakeholders. The Motion Tracker provides guidance on how to share progress and celebrate it, ensuring wide reach and appreciation for the hard work done in service of healthy women, girls, and families.

This Policy brief showcases the progress made, through joint partner participation and engagement while addressing bottlenecks to realizing Uganda commitments to FP2020 and EWEC Global Strategy for the reporting period January-June, 2018. The partners that have contributed to this progress total 73 as at June, 2018.
